Last Saturday I went with a group of children from Kilmington Primary School to sing in Exeter Cathedral.

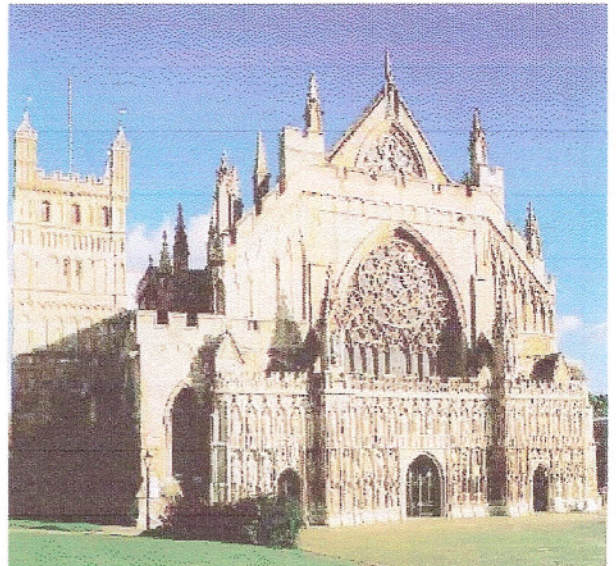
We all met at Exeter Cathedral then when all the other schools had arrived we had two hours practicing!
