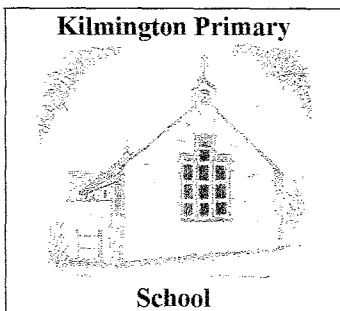

Dear Parents,

The children who attended the choir concert at Exeter Cathedral last week had a really super experience and below is a report from our Head Boy and Girl who attended the event.

'We arrived at the cathedral feeling scared but excited at the same time. Before the performance began we had a TWO HOUR practice time! But as we began to sing the nerves vanished and the acoustics were fabulous. We started by singing 'I can see clearly now', then each school sang their own song. We sang 'Prince of Peace', and Seaton played an instrumental and the violin sounded excellent. This week I have received a letter from the St Petrock's Centre in Exeter. It wishes me to pass on their thanks to all the parents and children at the school for the donation of Harvest Festival Produce. It goes on to say the produce they received from us will help them to provide the 40-60 meals a day they are currently providing, each weekday, fifty-one weeks of the year.

As many of you will know, next Friday, 20 November is 'Children In Need Day'. As always we want to support this charity but are mindful that as a school we have already asked for support re the Harvest and also the Shoe Box Appeal. Therefore, we thought we would keep it simple and ask the children to come in wearing a 'Pudsey Bandana'. We thought the children could make one of these at home from some white material and colour in large multi-coloured spots with a felt tip. I have attached some information showing how they might be worn or if you felt inclined you could buy one from the stores mentioned. We do have a limited supply of white material so if anybody is struggling then children can make one at school for a charge of 50p. We are also going to try and make a line of copper coins that will stretch for 1km around the playground. Therefore, could the children please bring in as many unwanted 1p and 2p coins as possible. At the end of the day these will be collected in and donated to the charity.

Just to inform you that there will be a traffic survey being carried out in the village next week on Tuesday and Friday. There will be a rota of people sitting in cars in the Village Car Park between 8am and 6pm. It is nothing to do with the school but I wanted to alert you so you weren't alarmed about possible strangers making notes while you delivering and collecting your children.
