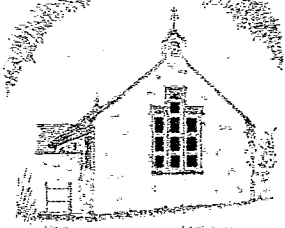

Dear Parents,

Next week on Tuesday, 13 October the children are having their second Theatre Company visit, this time it is the Exeter based Theatre Alibi. We are being joined by Shute School for this performance. Whereas, last week was very much linked into our Literacy work, this performance is more linked into our Personal, Social, Health Education curriculum.

Please don't forget next Thursday, 15 October as it is our Harvest Festival Celebration being held in St Giles Church at 2:45pm. All the children are very much looking forward to welcoming you to their theme of 'Harvest at Home and in Africa'. This year we would very much like to collect as much tinned, dried and packet food as possible. We are putting large wicker baskets in each class and hope we can fill them by Thursday to display at the celebration. After the celebration the baskets will then be taken down to St Petrock's Centre in Exeter for the homeless. I spoke to the children about this and they agreed it was a good idea to share what they have with others less fortunate than themselves and they realised it isn't just places like Africa where there is poverty and homelessness. Any produce you can spare can be brought into school next week from Monday onwards.

On Friday, 16 October Yarty Class will be going to the Multi-Skills Festival at the Axe Valley Sports Hall. They will be leaving school at 12:30pm by coach after an earlier lunch and will be returning at 3pm for normal home time. Can you please ensure the children have their PE kits in school that day and a water bottle is also a good idea, though there will be drinks and rest stations at the event. To ensure you have read this information can I ask you to return the form giving permission for your child/children to take part by Wednesday of next week.

On the reverse of this letter is the rota for the Dad's and Granddad's Week.

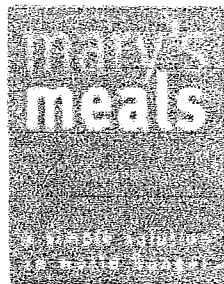
